



CARNALEA GOLF CLUB STANDARD OF DRESS

Applicable to members, guests and visitors.

Carnalea Golf Club subscribes to the codes for Standard of dress recommended by the **Golfing Union of Ireland** and the **Irish Ladies Golfing Union**.

Whilst we wish our Members and Visitors to feel at ease, smart dress is required at all times and we would ask you to observe our dress standards. Any clothes worn including denim must not be soiled as in work jeans, not torn or frayed or with appendages such as chains attached.

The Club reserves the right to refuse access to the Clubhouse or Course to anyone dressed inappropriately.

Club House

The following items of dress **are not** acceptable at any time:

- Caps (except for religious or medical reasons)
- Shirts specific to other sports – soccer, rugby etc.
- Garments displaying excessive branding, numbers or wording
- Singlets, sleeveless or collarless shirts ('grandad collars' are acceptable) and V-neck sweaters without a shirt
- Tracksuits or track suit bottoms
- Sports and ¾ length shorts
- Any footwear worn on the course

All shorts (knee length) and trousers must be tailored. Cut off trousers must also be tailored. Gentlemen must always wear socks with shorts and also with sandals/flip flops. Ladies may choose not to wear socks in the club house. Gents shirts must have a collar ('grandad collars' are acceptable).

Function Nights

Smart casual dress is acceptable including smart jeans.

Restaurant

Members & Visitors are required to wear smart dress in the Ailsa Craig Suite on a Saturday evening which will include smart jeans.

On the Course

The following items of dress **are not** acceptable at any time:

- Shirts specific to other sports – soccer, rugby etc. and shirts displaying excessive branding, numbers or wording
- Sun tops or beachwear
- Tracksuits or track suit bottoms
- Torn frayed or soiled clothes of any description or with appendages such as chains
- Sports or untailored shorts. Trousers are not to be worn inside socks

A persistent breach of the Dress Code may result in disciplinary action being taken in respect of the member and to a visitor being asked to leave the clubhouse or course.

The Bar Manager and Staff have the right to approach a member or visitor if the Dress Code is not adhered to.

The member/visitor will be informed of the Dress Code and it will be explained that it must be adhered to on their next visit.

A copy of the Dress Code will be supplied to the person(s) concerned.

Members must always sign in their guests and are responsible for them during their visit.
